Essential Point of Care Tools



Previous accounts must lapse prior to linking to Duke's institutional access.

1. Go to the [library's website](#)
2. Click on *UpToDate* under Quicklinks.
3. In UpToDate, create a personal account using the Register link, located in the upper right hand corner.
4. Download the app in App Store / Play.
5. Activate the app with your login.

NOTE: must authenticate from Duke WiFi /VPN every 90 days.



1. Go to [DynaMed](#), via the library's Clinical Tools page.
2. In DynaMed, click on the "Sign In" link, in the upper right hand corner. Then, click "Register Now" to create your account.
3. Download the app from App Store / Play.
4. Activate the app with your personal login.

Drug Resources



1. Go to [this Lexicomp link](#) from the library's Databases A-Z list.
2. Click the "Mobile App Codes" button on the right and then follow the directions.
3. Download the app from App Store/Play.
4. Open app, sign in with personal account and select the Lexicomp databases of interest to download.



For this app, you must be on the Duke's campus WiFi or VPN to set up the account.

1. On the VPN, go to this [Micromedex](#) link from the library's Databases A-Z list.
2. In Micromedex, click the "Download Mobile Apps" button in the bottom right corner for the instructions and code.
3. Install app, open, and enter the code.

2. Once in UCentral, register for a personal account.
3. Download the uCentral app, log in.
